2024 JUNIOR AUXILIARY BILOXI-OCEAN SPRINGS SERVICE PROJECTS WHAT WE DO

As individuals and a chapter, we at JABOS continually look for ways to improve the lives of children by developing and implementing programs to meet physical, medical, emotional and educational needs. This is accomplished through community service projects in the health, welfare, civic, educational and cultural fields and by working closely with schools and other organizations in our community that help us identify needs and meet them.

BRIDGE THE GAP

This project serves the emotional need of children by providing inclusive activities that appreciate their differences, boost their confidence, and provide a sense of belonging within their community. The project places culturally diverse books in 5 tiny libraries in the service area, provides an activity tent at the annual Gulf Coast Equality festival, hosts "AU-some" paint parties welcoming kids with autism, bingo nights with DREAM, pop up dress shop for A Night to Shine, free photos with Santa, and the Bridge the Gap 'Icons' photo shoot.

COMMUNITY CONNECTION

Focuses on meeting the needs of the community through partnerships other schools, nonprofits, governmental agencies, or other agencies. This project has partnered with the Special Needs Organization of South Mississippi, Feeding the Gulf Coast, Angel Tree, Community Care Network, Girl Scouts and others in our service area. The project is also home to **Buckets of Happiness**, which supplies disadvantaged pediatric patients with personal hygiene as well as fun, educational items to assist them during their hospital stay.

CROWN CLUB

Crown Club is an organization of high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors in the JABOS service area. Members are selected by a committee through an online application process. The Crown Club's mission is to foster interest in social, economic, educational, civic, and cultural conditions among its members. Crown Club serves our community through projects selected or created by its members, such as Welcome Back Art and Banners for schools, CASA Christmas Stockings, Night to Shine special needs Prom, and a variety of other community activities. The JABOS Committee strives to develop character and leadership of Crown Club members while identifying needs and demonstrating the act of caring for others.

FIT 4 LIFE

Fit4Life is a project that addresses the mental and physical well-being of children in our service area. They are introduced to healthy eating habits, physical fitness, and lifestyle tools to promote an active and healthy lifestyle. The ultimate goal is to equip the children with a foundation of mental and physical health.

HOMECOMING & PROM CLOSET

Provides formal dresses, jewelry, and accessories to middle and high school-aged young ladies for homecoming and prom events at minimal cost. Young ladies are showered with one-on-one attention from members to find the perfect attire and encourage self-confidence.

I MATTER*

Our Chapter's National Service project is "I MATTER". Each year, chapter members establish a relationship with a local family with children. Focuses on breaking the cycle of dependency by providing the basic necessities of life including food, clothing, shelter, and emotional support through ongoing chapter and recipient relationships. We address the family's needs and help the family get on their feet to become a self-sufficient part of society.

KIDS IN COURT KARE (KICKS)

KiCKs project serves the children of Jackson County CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates). CASA Volunteers are community volunteers, just like you, who stand up and speak out to help children who have experienced abuse or neglect. Jackson County CASA supports these CASA Volunteers to advocate for the best interests of children who are in the Jackson County Family Court system due to abuse or neglect. KiCKs provides for the children of CASA through the following service opportunities: Back to School Backpacks filled with School Supplies, Halloween Buckets, Adoption Day Celebration, Christmas Blessing Bags, monthly Birthday Wishes, and Easter Baskets

LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

Assisting students academically, financially, socially, physically and emotionally for what life has to offer after graduation. Our mission is to foster and help positively shape students to be their most successful self after they leave the K-12 environment, in every aspect of their lives. The experiences students have during K-12 greatly impacts how successful of a young adult they will become. This project serves the community by hosting ACT prep workshops, creating career/college fairs, holding healthy relationship/dating seminar, providing a special treat for state test students, and planning "Stay Safe and Play" events. Whether a student plans to enter college, the workforce, military or any other path he/she may take, this project provides assistance to achieve success. This project also awards Ann Wesson scholarships to high school seniors in memory of one of the past JABOS presidents and National Junior Auxiliary Scholarship Committee Member, Mrs. Ann Wesson. Scholarships are awarded based on the following criteria: student need, extracurricular activities, community service, academics, essay response and referrals. This scholarship gives students who are truly in need of financial assistance a chance to make their future a little brighter.

SCHOOLAID

All members of JABOS are assigned a school in either Biloxi, Ocean Springs, D'Iberville, St. Martin, and Vancleave School Districts to help provide clothing, school supplies, medical, dental, and financial assistance for children that are in need. This is all in partnership with the school counselors, nurses, and teachers. Once a student in need is identified by the school, the assigned member is called to fill the request as needed. We find that working directly with the schools opens up many needs that otherwise we would not know.

TOMORROW'S PROMISES

Our members visit children residing at the The Gulf Coast Women's Center for Non-Violence once a week while their mothers are in group sessions. We want the children to know that we are there for them and to be a positive influence as they grow and strive past their circumstances. We encourage good grades, help with homework, tutoring, provide snacks as well as physical and mental activities.


